

# MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD

Happy fall y'all! As autumn arrives, we are greeted by the beautiful sight of falling leaves, vibrant orange and yellow hues, and the comforting taste of pumpkin spice lattes. This season is my personal favorite, bringing a sense of energy and excitement to our community. The cooler temperatures encourage us to spend more time outdoors, whether it is taking neighborhood walks or gathering with friends and family. It is also a wonderful opportunity to participate in upcoming community events and activities, which are designed to help residents connect and celebrate together.

**Budget Season Overview:** While fall is a time for enjoyment, it also marks the beginning of our annual budget season — a less favored but particularly important period. This is when the Budget Committee begins meeting to develop the financial plan for the coming year. Each year brings its own set of challenges as we work diligently to balance and produce a workable budget. Remarkably, since the first budget was prepared without the builder, we have consistently managed to stay within 1 to 2 percent of our projected budget — an achievement any corporation would be proud of.

**Understanding Our Operating Budget:** Four Seasons Beaumont operates as a corporation with an approximate \$5.7 million operating budget. Achieving accuracy within such a narrow margin is notable, especially considering that 88 percent of our budget is dedicated to vendor contracts. These contracts cover a variety of services, from large providers like Park West and FirstService to smaller ones such as pool cleaning and music in our facilities. This allocation leaves only 12 percent of the budget available for other expenses.

**Vendor Management and Cost Control:** The Board of Directors actively collaborates with vendors each year to prevent excessive price increases. We review factors such as the Customer Price Index (CPI) for Riverside County, the current rate of inflation, and recommendations from our Reserve Study. Six months prior to the end date of any contract, the Board assesses the expected increase. Vendors have their own constraints as well, so if proposed increases exceed reasonable thresholds, or if we have had a long-term relationship with a vendor,

we request competitive bids through a Request for Proposal (RFP) process. This helps ensure we are not overpaying and provides insight into market pricing, often revealing a wide range of costs for identical services.

**Planning for Capital Expenses:** In addition to operating costs and reserve study recommendations, the Board collaborates closely with all committees to anticipate potential capital expenses for the year. There are expenditures which are not tied to contracts or included in the reserve study, such as a new amenity like a volleyball court and equipment. Identifying these needs in advance allows the Board to decide whether to include them in the upcoming budget.

**The Budget Approval Process:** Over the next few months, the Budget Committee will meet several times to thoroughly review the budget line by line, making decisions on which costs to eliminate or adjust. Once the committee finalizes the budget, it is forwarded to the finance team and then to the Board for approval. This process must be completed by the November Board meeting and distributed to the community by Nov. 30, in compliance with Civil Code. When you receive the packet from Four Seasons, please review it carefully — it will include the full budget and a letter from our President, Jerry Monahan, outlining the new dues for 2026.

After the budget is finalized, the Board will vote in an open session to officially approve it. A detailed breakdown of the budget will be presented at that meeting, and I will also provide an overview in my December article. Stay tuned for more information.

The Board holds its General Session on the second Thursday of each month at 1 pm in the Ballroom. In addition, a less formal meet-and-greet is held on the third Wednesday of each month at 2 pm, also in the Ballroom. This forum gives residents the opportunity to speak with Board members about any topic except those currently under litigation or discussed in Executive Session. Several Board members attend each month, fostering open communication and engagement within our community.

**SUMMIT CLOSURE** On the heels of the pool replastering, by the time this reaches you we will have moved to pool deck resurfacing as well as repainting the interior and exterior for The Summit. Work was scheduled to start on Sept. 22 and will conclude on Oct. 17. We are making sure that everything is wrapped up before Winter Hours go into effect. The Summit turned 11 years old this year and with the different work this year with new tile, quartz shower, paint, and replaster, it is practically a brand new building.

**ANNIVERSARY PARADE** The Association will be holding a 20th Anniversary Parade on Saturday, Oct. 4. Please be aware that the flow of traffic on Four Seasons Circle will be impacted and will be one way, opposite of the flow of the Parade while the parade is going. The parade is planned to go from 10:30 to 11:30 am on Four Seasons Circle going from The Lodge to the Windmill Bridge, Courts, Summit and back to The Lodge. Please join us at The Lodge after the parade for festivities including an In-N-Out truck, music and fun!

**AUGUST DOLLARS AND CENTS** At the July Board meeting, the following projects and bids were approved. Please note in parentheses is the Committee that generated the proposal and then stating either an Operational expense which comes from this year's dues, or a Reserve expense:

- Tinkers Creek & Arches Park plant removal - \$31,700 (Landscape/Operational)
- Plantings Phase A - \$943.50 (Landscape/Operational)
- Summit Interior/Exterior Painting - \$43,950 (Facilities/Reserves)
- Summit Pool Deck Resurface - \$15,387.50 (Facilities/Reserves)
- Power Washer Upgrade - \$947.81 (Facilities/Operational)
- Facilities Mosquito Eliminators - \$1,771.71 (Facilities/Capital)

**DAILY REPORT** If you're not receiving Four Seasons Beaumont daily emails/Activities Blasts, email [issues@fourseasonsbeaumont.org](mailto:issues@fourseasonsbeaumont.org) to have your email added to the list of recipients. Having your email on the list is especially important in order to receive warnings and updates related to emergencies in our area (example: July 2025 Wolf Fire).

**REMINDERS** A reminder I give at each Open Session Board Meeting is to slow down. Once you are home behind the gates, speeding or not stopping at stop signs will only "save" you a few seconds of time. Speed limits are 30 mph on the Circle, 25 mph on all side streets, and 15 mph in parking lots. Slow down and drive responsibly. Also, use the sidewalks if you're a pedestrian and wear white or reflective clothing when it's dark outside.

Make sure to fob-in each and every time you enter a facility. One, it's the rule, and two, team members rotate through the different facilities and the person that is at the desk when you return might not be the one who was there originally.

“Understanding the Weather” – A Series by Mel Zeldin, Retired Meteorologist

# Fall 2025 Weather Outlook

Overall, this past summer has been fairly normal, but with an unusually cool July and a warmer-than-normal August. Looking forward to the fall months, outlooks for temperature and precipitation from the Climate Prediction Center are shown below.




Fig 1. Temperature outlook for fall 2025

For temperatures, in Figure 1, the projections are again for most of the country to be above normal with only the northern tier of states having equal chances for above-normal or below-normal temperatures. For Southern California, we are indicated to be above normal again with the greatest chances of above-normal temperatures centered over New Mexico.




Fig 2. Precipitation outlook for fall 2025

For precipitation, in Figure 2, Southern California is again

indicated to have equal chances of above or below normal rainfall. This would suggest that we will likely have some storms as we get into the latter part of the fall season, but not unusually wetter than normal. Nationally, the greatest chances for above-normal precipitation are in the Pacific Northwest and the Great Lakes region.

Also, as we get into fall, we can experience Santa Ana winds which can sometimes produce gusts to 50 mph or even greater. There are no indications whether such winds will be more predominant than what typically occurs.

# THE CABLE CABAL

Have you heard the term “cord cutting”? I am not into conspiracy theories. Frankly, I have no use for them.

However, if I were to believe in a conspiracy theory, even one I invented, it would center around cord cutting. Cord cutting refers to canceling traditional cable or satellite TV subscriptions in favor of streaming. As you will see if you read on, I’m not against cord cutting. But what I am against is the idea streaming services put forth to encourage us to cut the cord. The sales pitch is why pay for all those channels included in your cable service when you watch only a small fraction of them. Save money the pitch goes, by canceling cable and signing up for just what you watch.

Originally you could, in fact, save money this way. That’s where the conspiracy theory comes in. It was the old “loss leader” approach. They get us to cut the cord and sign up. Then comes the price increases. And what do you know?! We end up paying more now than we did for cable. That’s because, unlike cable, there isn’t one place that offers streaming alternatives for one price.

But, as I mentioned above, I am not against cord cutting. In fact, I myself have cut the cord. The tie in to my column is that once you cut the cord, you have entered the world of apps — streaming apps. You can’t watch Netflix without using an app. Streaming apps are built into most modern TVs. There are also streaming devices like Roku whose sole job is to be a platform for streaming apps.

And just about any app on your streamer or TV also has a smartphone app. Have you ever searched for a show on your TV using a cursor to enter letters individually, it’s a pain. (Thankfully many remote controls now allow you to speak your preference.) Using the app on your phone for a search is much quicker. It’s much faster to flick through a guide on your phone than on a big screen.

Which brings me to my recent cutting of the cord with Spectrum.

Frankly, I’ve never had much of a problem with cable until recently. Years ago, I used a TiVo DVR with both Spectrum and Frontier. But both have dropped support for TiVo and you can’t even get TV service from Frontier. So, I had to use Spectrum’s DVR which I had to regularly disconnect and reconnect from/to power to get it to work properly.

It turns out there are several TV services available that function like cable TV, but they are internet apps. The most popular seems to be YouTube TV. I tried it. For one, it’s expensive. But the deal breaker for me was its DVR function.

By now, I assume you know what people mean when they refer to “the cloud.” It just means, instead of storing stuff (TV shows, movies, financial data, etc.) on your DVR or computer, it’s stored on an internet server. All those shows on Netflix are stored “in the cloud.” You can program YouTube to record a show and have it instantly available even though YouTube stores it on its own servers. It functions like a DVR connected to your TV. But as much as I dislike my Spectrum DVR, I found YouTube’s DVR even worse. Spectrum itself has a cloud TV service. But I’ve given up on Spectrum. For one, I don’t like their phone app.

The service I settled on is DirecTV Stream. And the reason I chose it is how its app functions whether I’m using it on my streamer or my phone. I like how smoothly it is when I’m scrolling through its guide. I like how easy it is to program a recording. I like being able to choose a channel and flick through its programming. And since my shows are stored in the cloud, I can access them anywhere I have an internet connection. I can watch them on my phone or connect my phone to a TV.

## COMMUNITY AWARENESS

It is important to stay aware of common elder fraud schemes that are widespread today. The Elder Abuse Prevention and Prosecution Act was signed into law in October 2017 to prevent elder abuse and exploitation, and to improve the justice system's response to victims in elder abuse and exploitation cases.

**WHAT IS ELDER FRAUD?** The U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) defines elder abuse as an intentional or negligent act by any person that causes harm or a serious risk of harm to an older adult, including financial exploitation and fraud.

The Internet Crime Complaint Center (IC3) is the FBI office responsible for handling Elder Fraud complaints.

### COMMON ELDER FRAUD SCHEMES

- Romance scam: Criminals pose as interested romantic partners on social media or dating websites.
- Tech Support scam: Criminals pose as technology or customer support, offering help with non-existent issues like computer viruses or hacked accounts.
- Grandparent scam: Criminals pretend to be a relative, usually a child or grandchild, claiming to be in urgent financial need.
- Government Impersonation scam: Criminals pose as government employees, threatening to arrest or prosecute victims unless they pay.
- Sweepstakes/Lottery/Inheritance scam: Criminals claim the victim has won a lottery or sweepstakes, or is inheriting money from a distant relative, however, they have to send money to cover fees and taxes before the funds can be released to them.
- Investment scam: Criminals promote unsuitable or fraudulent investments, resulting in theft or misuse of funds.
- Charity scam: Criminals claim to work for a charity to gain trust and solicit donations.
- TV/Radio scam: Criminals target potential victims with ads about services like reverse mortgages or credit repair.
- Family/Caregiver scam: Perpetrators are relatives or acquaintances who exploit or steal from the elderly.
- Non-Delivery of Product: Victims don't receive online purchases or the items differ from descriptions, often advertised on social media.

### PROTECT YOURSELF

- Avoid pressure to act quickly. Criminals create urgency to instill fear and prompt immediate actions.
- Be cautious with unsolicited calls, mail, or door-to-door offers.
- Never share personally identifiable information.
- Never wire money to people or businesses met only online.
- Keep your computer security software up to date. If you see a suspicious pop-up or locked screen, disconnect from the internet and turn off your device.

- Do not open unfamiliar emails or click on unknown links or attachments.
- Research online ads and companies before purchasing to verify legitimacy.
- Stop communication with the scammer.
- Many families have a word or phrase they use to verify each other. For example, if someone calls claiming to be a child or grandchild, you can ask, "what's the secret word?"

### REPORT IT

If you or someone you know might be a victim of elder fraud, file a complaint with the Internet Crime Complaint Center (IC3) at [www.ic3.gov](http://www.ic3.gov).

Be ready to provide:

- Financial transaction details.
- Information used by criminals, such as bank accounts, addresses, emails, websites, and phone numbers.
- Keep original records for law enforcement.
- Contact your financial institutions and credit bureaus to protect your accounts and monitor for suspicious activity.

## ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW COMMITTEE

Most of us moved into Four Seasons Beaumont without knowing that locals refer to the city as Blowmont. We quickly learned that the wind is something we need to be aware of and have made accommodations to deal with the high winds.

Last month, several homeowners experienced wind damage to trees and other plants in their yards. If you need to replace a tree due to wind damage, you may need ARC approval. If you remove the damaged tree, you do not need ARC approval if you replace it with the same type of tree and it came in a 2-foot box (or 15-gallon container).

If you choose to replace the tree with a different type of tree or decide not to replace it, ARC approval is required.

Please note that the city code requires at least two trees in all front yards. This means you must replace the tree unless there are still two trees in the yard.

The two-tree rule does not apply to backyards. Whether you replace the tree or not, or choose a different type of tree, ARC approval is necessary.

Whenever you have a tree that needs to be removed, even if you plan to replace it, contact the management office promptly. This helps them coordinate with landscapers if needed and ensures ARC is aware that you are addressing the issue according to ARC Guidelines. It's important for ARC to know you are working on the issue rather than ignoring it.

If you need help understanding the ARC Guidelines, please contact any ARC member. We can provide guidance and clarify what you need to do.

Additionally, ARC has been contacted by homeowners who

received a letter from their insurance company requiring modifications to their home and landscape before a policy can be issued. If you receive such a demand, ARC will assist you in getting the changes approved.

To avoid potential fines from the HOA, do not make any modifications without ARC approval. If requirements conflict, ARC will work with you and, if necessary, expedite the process, especially if you have a deadline that cannot be met during scheduled ARC meetings.

These modifications include removal of planted material and repairs to roofs and stucco. While repairs do not need ARC approval, any exterior changes to your house or landscape require ARC approval. Please include a copy of the letter explaining what changes are required. ARC cannot approve verbal requests that fall outside the ARC Guidelines.

## FINANCE COMMITTEE

Budget is the focus for the Finance Committee over the next few months. We spend time reviewing all our accounts and historical data for the last year to determine needs for the community. Be assured that we are concerned about your HOA fees as we prepare the budget and review the fees. The committee always works hard for the benefit of the community.

The financial statements for July 2025 were reviewed and recommended for Board approval. In addition, the committee reviewed expenditure proposals for various recommended projects in the community. We also reviewed investment recommendations to move maturing investments to higher yield FDIC insured instruments. Highlights of the July financial statements are: Total Cash is \$11,630,960 including operating cash funds of \$2,251,058 (checking and CDs) and reserve account funds of \$9,376,088 and

reconstruction funds of \$3,814. Our total year-to-date current income is \$100,293.

Homeowners are welcome to join us at the Finance Committee's regularly scheduled monthly meetings held on the last Tuesday of each month. Our next meeting will be Tuesday, Oct. 28 at 1 pm in the RCN Conference Room. The Finance Committee reviews and discusses many issues that you may have questions about. Residents are welcome to attend one of our meetings to become more familiar with our finances. At the beginning of each meeting, we allow three minutes per homeowner not to exceed 30 minutes in total for comments.



# SAFETY COMMITTEE SAFETY 4 “ALL” SEASONS

As we enter autumn, the Safety Committee remains dedicated to ensuring our community is a safe place to live. It is fall, but you don't have to fall for it!

## FACTS ABOUT FALLS

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), millions of people, especially those 65 and older, fall each year. In fact, more than one out of four older adults fall annually, yet fewer than half tell their doctor. Falling once doubles your risk of falling again.

## Falls are Serious and Costly

- One in 10 falls results in an injury that causes the senior to limit activities for a day or more to seek medical attention.
- Approximately three million emergency department visits occur annually due to falls among older adults.
- Nearly one million fall-related hospitalizations happen each year.
- About 319,000 older individuals are hospitalized annually for hip fractures.
- Falls are the leading cause of traumatic brain injuries.

## Conditions Increasing the Likelihood of a Fall

Research identifies many risk factors that contribute to falling. Many of these can be changed or managed to prevent falls. They include:

- Lower body weakness
- Vitamin D deficiency
- Walking and balance difficulties
- Use of medications such as tranquilizers, sedatives, or antidepressants. Even over-the-counter medicines can affect balance.
- Vision problems
- Foot pain or inadequate footwear
- Home hazards such as broken or uneven stairs, clutter or throw rugs that pose tripping hazards


Most falls result from a combination of risk factors. The more risk factors present, the higher the likelihood of falling.

Healthcare providers can help reduce these risks through fall prevention strategies both in medical settings and within the community.

## After a Fall

Many falls do not cause injuries. However, about 37 percent of falls that do result in injuries require medical treatment or restrict activity for at least a day. These injuries can impair mobility, daily activities, and independence.

Falls can cause broken bones like wrist, arm, ankle, and hip fractures.



Head injuries are also common and serious, especially if medications like blood thinners are involved. Anyone who hits their head after a fall should see a doctor immediately to rule out a brain injury.

Even if uninjured, many fall victims develop a fear of falling, which may lead to reduced activity. This lack of activity weakens muscles and increases the fall risk over time.

## FALL-PROOF YOUR HOME

We might think we are always safe on flat ground, but thousands of injuries each year tell a different story ... According to the National Safety Council, falls while walking or working

on ground level are major causes of serious injury and death among older adults. To help prevent falls, consider:

- Keeping floors and surfaces free of clutter
- Closing cabinets and desk drawers
- Keeping electrical and phone cords out of walkways
- Wearing proper, sensible footwear
- Never standing on chairs, tables, or wheeled surfaces
- Arranging furniture to create open pathways, and keeping file cabinets and drawers closed
- Maintaining good lighting indoors and outdoors

Remember, aging can affect vision, strength, and balance. As a result, adults 65 and older are at a higher risk for falls. However, falls are not an inevitable part of aging and can be prevented.

As a safety reminder, unsafe driving is a common concern among residents. Here are key tips to keep our community safe:

- Maximum speed in residential areas is 25 mph.
- Speed limit on Four Seasons Circle is 30 mph.
- In alleyways, the speed limit is 15 mph. Parking in alleyways is prohibited to keep access open for emergency vehicles.
- Always stop at designated STOP signs.
- Yield to vehicles entering roundabouts.
- When entering a roundabout, proceed counterclockwise only.
- Avoid distracted driving by putting away cell phones and electronic devices.
- Yield to pedestrians.
- Drivers should follow careful driving practices. Even though streets lack center lines, stay to the right side of the roadway.

# Chocolate Mayonnaise Cake

The recipe this month is from my neighbor, Sherry Mounts, and is her family's version of the classic chocolate mayonnaise cake. The addition of raisins, nuts, and cinnamon transforms the classic into a lovely cake well-suited to fall. Sherry's version did not call for topping the cake. I made a few additions to transform this lovely cake into a fall spooktacular. Serve this cake in a manner that suits your fancy.

## INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup raisins
- 1 cup hot water
- Vegetable oil for greasing the pans
- 1 cup chopped nuts (I used walnuts)
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 3/4 cup mayonnaise
- 2 Tablespoons unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 2 cups flour
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

## CAKE DIRECTIONS

1. Combine raisins and hot water, set aside.
2. Position oven rack in the center of the oven and preheat oven to 350 degrees. Lightly grease and flour the bottom and sides of two 9-inch round cake pans with the vegetable oil, set aside.
3. In a large mixing bowl, combine the raisin/water mixture, nuts, baking soda, sugar, mayonnaise, cocoa, and cinnamon until all ingredients are incorporated. Add the flour and vanilla, mixing until thoroughly combined. Pour batter into prepared pans.
4. Bake in preheated oven for approximately 30 to 40 minutes, until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean or with a few crumbs.
5. Cool the cakes in the pan on a wire rack for ten minutes. Remove the cakes from the pan and allow them to cool completely. You may sprinkle each cake layer with powdered sugar and serve, or frost with chocolate frosting and/or decorate with marshmallow webbing.

## OPTIONAL TOPPINGS

For spider web or mummy decoration: 2 cups mini marshmallows, about 4 ounces; Cooking spray or vegetable oil; Candy spiders or candy eyes

## TO MAKE THE SPIDER WEB/MUMMY DECORATION

Microwave the marshmallows in a microwave-safe medium bowl until they swell and are soft enough to stir, about 1 minute. Watch constantly. Remove from microwave and let sit a minute or two until cool enough to handle. Lightly coat your hands with cooking spray or vegetable oil. For a spider web, pick up a tablespoon-sized blob of the melted marshmallow and stretch it over and around the cake; repeat so that the strings of marshmallow crisscross one another in many directions, and continue until you have what looks like a spider web. For a mummy, stretch the marshmallow so that all the strings on the top of the cake run in the same direction, leaving a small gap between strings for the mummy's eyes to peek out. Garnish with a candy spider or several candy spiders for the web cake or candy eyes for the mummy cake.



## TAILS & TRAILS - ALL PETS

We are very fortunate to have a wonderful pet group here at Four Seasons, known as Tails and Trails. If your pet becomes lost or goes missing, our Pet Recovery team (part of Tails and Trails) can help in bringing them home. Just call (951) 663-7012. Our Pet Recovery team consists of volunteers eager to assist fellow pet owners. These volunteers are trained in trapping, safely bringing lost pets to safety, scanning, and reuniting pets with their owners.

We are looking for new members to help us with these meaningful efforts. Here are some tips if your pet goes missing: do not chase your pet. Stay home, secure other pets, open your doors and gates, and report the missing pet. Collect some dirty laundry, pillowcases, undergarments, gym clothes, socks, recently worn shoes, and place them in a pile or basket on your front porch. For cats, put out their used litter box. If your pet has a favorite bed or blanket, add that to the pile. Tails & Trails will help network your lost pet while we search, and we will offer advice for bringing your pet home safely. Spreading your scent around while searching may only confuse their sense of smell and hinder their return.

Very few stray dogs are likely to approach you, especially if you

don't have food. Some may be very friendly and willing to jump into your vehicle. Never approach or chase a stray dog. This can make them run further away, increase their stress, and complicate recovery. Pets may become exhausted or hide. Keep dogs as close to you as possible. Speak softly and soothingly. Stay still and encourage them to come to you. If you have food, you can drop a few pieces to attract the animal.

## BIRDING CLUB

Fall bird migration lasts from Aug. 1 through November's end. Migration peak times differ by region and species, influenced by food availability, daylight hours, and weather changes. The Cornell Lab estimates around four billion birds migrate within the U.S. during fall, with global figures around five billion moving between breeding and non-breeding areas. Most migration, especially among songbirds, happens at night.

Bird migrations are tracked by radar, and live maps are available for viewers. You can go to <https://birdcast.info/> to see maps and learn more about migration activities. These organizations leverage over 20 years of tracking data to predict migration peaks and help reduce threats like light pollution and aircraft collisions.

Though ancient people did not understand migration, many theories arose about birds disappearing and reappearing. The earliest evidence might be from 1822 in Mecklenburg, Germany, where a stork was found with an arrow in its neck. The arrow was made of a fine-grained wood native to Central Africa. After surviving its migration, the bird was shot by a hunter and its

remains are still displayed.

The Arctic Tern is renowned for the longest migration of any bird, traveling 24,000 miles annually from pole to pole. Living up to 30 years, it can potentially travel up to 620,000 miles in its lifetime. Other long-distance migrants include the Bar-Tailed Godwit, which flies 6,800 miles nonstop from Alaska to New Zealand; the Short-Tailed Shearwater, which covers 18,500 miles between Southern Australia and Russia/Alaska; and the Red Knot, which migrates 9,000 miles from New England to southern South America. Although it seems odd that many species travel far north to breed, it's because summer days are longer in northern regions, providing more time for feeding and raising young.

The Birding Club walks the trails as a group on the first Saturday of each month. We meet at 8 am near the Potrero Creek sign at the edge of The Lodge parking lot. On Oct. 10, the Four Seasons Opera Club presents Verdi's *Rigoletto* in The Lodge Theater, *Rigoletto* has been part of the standard repertoire since its premiere in 1851 (Venice). *Rigoletto* tells the story of the licentious, misogynistic Duke of Mantua. The dramatic art turns around Rigoletto, the misshapen but witty, intelligent court jester to the Duke and his lovely, protected daughter, Gilda. *Rigoletto* has some of the most memorable music in all of opera, e.g., arias — "Questa o quella?", "La donna e mobile" and many more. The first translates to "this one or that one" and the duke goes on to assert that it doesn't matter. The latter means "women are fickle." Our presentation is from the Met's 1977 production and features Placido Domingo (at left) as the evil Duke and Cornell MacNeil as the unfortunate Rigoletto.

This month's automotive tip concerns your tires: **DO YOU KNOW HOW OLD YOUR TIRES ARE?** This is based on my experience while preparing my Corvette for this month's Cars & Coffee. My right rear tire unexpectedly burst (see photo). Fortunately, I was not driving or near the tire at the time.

I researched and discovered every tire has a date code indicating when it was manufactured. I identified this code on my tires and found they are 25 years old yet still had plenty of tread left. Tires manufactured since 2000 use the last four digits of the Tire Identification Number (TIN) to show the week and year of production — the first two digits for the week, and the last two for the year.

The big question is: How often should I replace my tires? The answer varies depending on several factors, including driving style

and road conditions. Most tires have a maximum safe lifespan of six years, even if they look fine.

**CHECK YOUR TIRE CODE!** It's easy to overlook tire age when they appear to operate well visually, especially if the tread seems intact and the rubber looks healthy. However (as I learned firsthand), appearances can be deceiving. Over time, tire rubber deteriorates due to exposure to oxygen, sunlight, and temperature changes, which weakens their structural integrity — even if the tread depth seems safe.




## BOOK CLUB

## AMATEUR RADIO

Ham radio’s origins stem from early wireless communication experiments conducted by figures like Marconi and Tesla. It evolved from a hobby into a formal system by the early 20th century. The term “ham” was ironically adopted from its derogatory use by professional telegraph operators. In 1927, the U.S. government established regulations and assigned specific frequencies for amateur radio operators, creating the official “ham radio” bands.

Hams serve as vital communication links during natural disasters or emergencies when traditional power grids and communication systems fail, often acting as a lifeline for communities.

Operators contribute to the development of new wireless technologies and experiment with various forms of radio communication — from bouncing signals off the moon to communicating with the international space station.

This hobby allows people worldwide to connect, build friendships, and engage socially with like-minded individuals.

Additionally, ham radio operators support local events like parades and marathons by providing reliable communication for



coordination.

The technology promotes global connectivity, fostering cultural exchange and understanding between operators in different countries.

Ham radio is used by a diverse range of individuals, including emergency responders, hobbyists, technologists, and public service volunteers, all sharing an interest in radio communication and experimentation. Users can be of any age or background, including students and professionals, and they often use ham radio for non-commercial purposes like disaster communication, international conversations, and self-training in electronics.

# RAINBOW GROUP



This month our selection for the Famous LGBT Americans series is John D’Emilio, a pioneer historian in gay studies.



D’Emilio was born in 1948 in New York City. He received three degrees from Columbia University: a B.A. in religious studies in 1970 (cum laude), an M.A. in 1972, and a Ph.D. in 1982, both in U.S. history. He was one of the first academics to focus his historical research on the gay community. In 1983, he began teaching at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro. In 1999, he moved to the University of Illinois

at Chicago where he is Emeritus Professor of Gender & Women’s Studies and History (he retired in 2014).

D’Emilio is the author or editor of almost a dozen books including *Sexual Politics, Sexual Communities: The Making of a Homosexual Minority in the United States, 1940-1970*; *Lost Prophet: The Life and Times of Bayard Rustin*; and *Intimate Matters: A History of Sexuality in America*, co-authored with Estelle B. Freedman.

D’Emilio has had a significant impact on laws affecting homosexuality in the United States. In the 1980s and 1990s, he

submitted affidavits challenging the constitutionality of sodomy statutes. D’Emilio’s book, *Intimate Matters*, was cited in 2003 by the landmark U.S.

Supreme Court majority opinion in *Lawrence v. Texas*, which declared consensual “sodomy” laws unconstitutional. D’Emilio was a coauthor of a historians’ brief, which the Court also cited.

D’Emilio has received many grants, awards, lecture invitations and fellowships. In 2005, he was inducted into the Chicago Gay and Lesbian Hall of Fame.

D’Emilio met Jim Oleson, his partner, in 1980. Oleson died at their home in 2015 at the age of 77.

D’Emilio described his passion for studying American history: “The ranks of graduate students studying U.S. history were populated with individuals like myself who believed that a knowledge of history was a critical resource in the effort to build a society grounded in justice, equality, and inclusion.” In 1973, he participated in a meeting focused on how historical and other research could be a tool for the LGBTQ movement. That meeting became the foundation of the Gay Academic Union.

Old cowboys share stories late into the night about seeing



## LIFE AFTER LOSS

### *"The Loss of Intimacy"*

One of the deepest losses following the death of a spouse is the loss of physical connection. Much more than just the physical act of sex, all survivors are suddenly and without warning, cast into an agonizing world of individual isolation . . . where physical touch and closeness are agonizingly absent. Gone are the familiar comforts of companionship. Instead, a cruel rendition of *Groundhog Day* is the new reality. Each new day is a haunting replication of the previous — isolation and solitude. Despite the best-wishes and supportive efforts of friends/family, it never bridges the void deep in your soul. You feel broken and in a state of perpetual disrepair.

Some thoughts to consider:

Acknowledge Your Feelings Without Shame: It's a natural human need to desire touch, connection, and physical affection, even after a loss. This is the way human beings are wired and the expression and desire is completely normal. Second, rather than viewing the need for connection as a betrayal of your spouse, regard it as a testament to the depth of the love you shared.

Prioritize Self-Care: Now that you are a widow/widower, take the time to connect with and appreciate your own body as well as your unique personality. Many times, a "reconnection" with ourselves is an important precursor to achieving a sense of healing. It is

possible to be alone without being lonely. This task can also ease the longing for physical connection with another person. Second, participate in hobbies and activities here at the Four Seasons that bring joy and a sense of comfort to help manage your emotions and ease the ache of missing intimacy.

Seek the Support of Others: Talk with friends and family with whom you have a close relationship. Though individual readiness varies, and the subject can be difficult to navigate, discussing your feelings and conversing about intimacy after a loss can be helpful. Should you sense the need, therapists can also provide valuable insights and strategies





## 4X4 SEASONS

Southern California’s deserts are filled with fascinating wildlife, and for off-road enthusiasts, the chance to spot some of these elusive desert dwellers adds to the thrill of the trail. Among the most iconic animals our group had the pleasure of seeing were these bighorn sheep, spotted navigating the rocky cliffs in Anza Borrego. These animals depend on remote, rugged terrain for safety and access to sparse water sources.

We also watch out for tarantulas, especially during the fall mating season when males roam in search of a mate. Despite their intimidating look, these large spiders are gentle and play an important role in the ecosystem.

Another incredible native species we’ve seen on our adventures is the desert horned lizard, often called a “horned toad” despite being a reptile. We discovered this one on a trip to Ocotillo Wells. They are usually found in open, dry areas, often near creosote bushes or cactus patches.

As we explore the wild landscape, it’s important to practice responsible off-road travel. Staying on designated trails helps protect delicate habitats from unnecessary damage, ensuring that wildlife like the bighorn sheep and horned lizards can continue to thrive. Carry out all trash, avoid driving over plants, and keep noise levels low near known wildlife areas. Following “Leave No Trace” principles isn’t just about protecting the environment — it’s about respecting the incredible natural world that makes our desert adventures so special. Let’s do our part to keep these areas wild for generations of off-roaders and desert species to come.




